REFLECTION ON TODAY'S READINGS

In our Gospel reading from Luke, some disciples of Jesus ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus instantly offers them the beautiful prayer which we, of course, call the **Our Father**.

The Our Father is truly a steward's prayer. In it, we call upon God in an intimate way, as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, everything is His, and our focus in life

should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and mercy towards us. We, too, commit to extending mercy ourselves (as we forgive those who sin against us).

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we recognize this basic truth about ourselves and God: **God is our Father**, **and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children**. This is the basis of a stewardship way of life.

At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus encourages us to pursue a relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, knock on His door!

He can hardly wait to bless us, HIs children. Remember that this week, then go, be a blessing to others! **Stewardship is just that simple.**

REFLEXIÓN DE LAS LECTURAS DE HOY



En el Evangelio según san Lucas, algunos discípulos le piden a Jesús que les enseñe a orar. Jesús, sin demora, les ofrece la hermosa oración que nosotros llamamos el **Padre Nuestro**.

El Padre Nuestro es, en verdad, una oración del buen administrador. En ella, invocamos a Dios de una manera íntima, como Padre. Le pedimos que se haga su voluntad (¡no la nuestra!) y que venga su Reino (¡no el nuestro!). Es decir,

recordamos que Él es nuestro Creador, que todo le pertenece, y que nuestro enfoque en la vida debe estar en sus prioridades, no en las nuestras. Luego le pedimos que supla nuestras necesidades (que nos dé el pan de cada día), que perdone nuestros pecados y que nos libre del mal. Es decir, proclamamos nuestra plena confianza en su providencia y en su misericordia. Y también nos comprometemos a extender esa misericordia (al perdonar a los que nos ofenden).

Al rezar el Padre Nuestro, reconocemos esta verdad fundamental sobre nosotros y sobre Dios: **Dios es nuestro Padre**, y nosotros somos sus hijos amados e infinitamente bendecidos. Esta es la base del estilo de vida del buen administrador cristiano.

Al final del pasaje evangélico, Jesús nos anima a buscar una relación con el Padre: ¡Pídele, búscalo, llama a su puerta!

Él está deseando bendecirnos, porque somos sus hijos. Recuerda eso esta semana... ¡y ve tú también a ser una bendición para los demás! La corresponsabilidad es así de simple.

A Little History of St. Joseph Church

from St. Joseph Church Archives – March 1981

(Continuing from last week's bulletin)

In the Main Part of the Church Looking from the Back

- The first five windows on the left starting from the back represent the Joyful mysteries of the rosary (the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Nativity, and Presentation, and the Finding;
- The sorrowful mysteries are represented by the sixth and fifth windows on the right-hand side (the Agony in the Garden, and the Scourging at the Pillar), the fifth and sixth windows on the left side (the Crowning with Thorns, and the Carrying of the Cross), and the picture window over the altar (the Crucifixion) note there is no depiction of the Burial of Christ;

- The glorious mysteries are found in the first five windows on the right (the Resurrection, the Ascension, the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles, the Assumption, and the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Angels and Saints;
- The last two main windows are the Marriage of Joseph and Mary, and the Baptism of the Lord;
- The high windows in the sanctuary: on the left the thorns with the nails and the veil of Veronica, and on the right the pillar of scourging with cross and crown of thorns;
- The upper windows over the main stained glass windows on the left have symbols of Mary (from back to front): "Sedis Sapientiae" or "Seat of Wisdom" with the censer of Prayer, the crown and the lily, the well and the fountain, and finally the sun and the heart pierced with a sword;
- The upper right windows (from back to front): the olive branch and the lily of the valley (peace and purity), the moon and the star, the tower of strength and the mirror of Justice, and finally the untouched garden and the ark of the covenant;
- The rose window, etc.: King David with harp is in the cente, and below is the death of Joseph with Mary and Jesus present.
